Sierra Nevada Tour

Report by Will McGuffin

On Feb. 9, a sunny but cold day, John Federspiel, Bob Bouvier, Bob DeBrecht and I met at the Sierra Nevada east coast brewery in Mills River to take the free tour. Our guide, Allen, was knowledgeable and enthusiastic and led us through all phases of how beer is brewed on a large scale. We were introduced to the four primary ingredients of beer (water, malted barley, hops and yeast) and then shown how Sierra Nevada



puts them together to make large varieties of excellent beer. We had “hands on” experience with hops, grinding them up between our palms to savor the aroma (accepting the hand cleanser offered to remove the residue), and were also allowed to taste sweet and hopped wort, a precursor to beer. We saw all phases of the brewing process and inhaled the aromas of hops and the fermentation process. The

tour ended with a tasting of eight varieties of beer following which three of us continued on to the restaurant for a meal. I highly recommend either taking the tour (you'll have to go on a weekday unless you want to wait a few months) or just wandering around on your own, slack-jawed with amazement at the scale of things! (Of course liking beer is probably a prerequisite.)
