MERF Scholarships

French Broad Mensa invites western North Carolina residents to apply for Mensa Education and Research Foundation Scholarships. One does not need to be a member of Mensa to apply. Anyone who will be enrolled in an accredited U.S. college, university, or community college for the Fall term of 2018 is eligible. Awards will be made on the basis of an essay of fewer than 550 words, which describes the applicant's career, vocational, or academic goal and how they plan to achieve the goal. Entries will be judged and awarded at three levels: local, regional and national. There will be at least one local \$600 award. Awards at other levels could be as much as \$1000.

Deadline for application is January 15, 2018

Selected Halloween Recipes



Glowing Black Widow Oreo Pops

White chocolate casts a soft glow on its own under a black light, but we gave it some extra oomph by mixing the melted chocolate with a little tonic water before dipping

Oreos in the mixture, then pressing a plastic spider on each one. (Psst... you may want to remind people to peel off the spider before eating, because they may get so psyched they inhale the whole pop without thinking.)



Halloween Meringue Bones

Ingredients:

8 large egg whites
Pinch of salt
500g caster sugar
4 tsp cornflour
1 scant tsp vanilla extract
2 tsp white wine vinegar



Heat your oven to

180°C/350°F. Line two baking trays with baking parchment.

Whisk the egg whites with the salt until they're holding firm peaks but are not stiff. Gently add in the sugar, spoonful after spoonful, still beating, until you've got a bowl full of snowy meringue. Sprinkle the cornflour, a few drops of vanilla and the vinegar on top and fold in to combine.

Draw the shapes of bones on each of the parchment-lined sheets. Spoon the meringue onto the baking parchment into the bone shapes. Put into oven, turn it down to 150° C/300°F and bake for 30 minutes.

Turn oven off and leave them in for 30 more minutes, then remove to cool. Transfer them, on their baking parchment, to wire racks.

Chef's Tip:

Serve with a bowl of whipped cream and chocolate sauce or dip each end in melted chocolate and wrap in see through plastic bags as great treat to give out on the doorstep. $\sum \sqrt{2}$



Finger Cookies

Witchy finger cookies: roll out some sugar-cookie dough into a thin line (make your cookies thin because they spread), apply an almond shard, then bake as directed.



Eyeball Cookies by Chef Dee Yield: 40 cookies





1/2 cup butter, softened
1 1/2 cups peanut butter
2 cups powdered sugar
1 tablespoon vanilla
12 ounces white dipping chocolate
1/2 cup mini chocolate chip
blue food coloring

Cream the butter and peanut butter together. Beat in the

vanilla and sugar. Chill for 1/2 hour. Roll into small balls, chill on wax paper for another 1/2 hour.

In a microwave, melt the white dipping chocolate. Using two spoons dip the eyeballs into the white chocolate.

Let the eyeballs cool on waxed paper until firm. Chilling speeds up the process.

Pour a drop or two of blue food coloring into the remaining melted chocolate. Make a round iris on the eyeball, and immediately press a miniature chocolate chip in the center for a pupil, doing 5 at at time.

For the bloodshot effect, dip the tiny end of a toothpick in red food coloring and squiggle the lines from the pupil outward, but not quite to the edges of the ball.

These are quite tasty - considering how creepy they are. Note: White dipping chocolate is also known as white bark.

October is Mensa Testing Month and most local groups will be testing. This year, the testing is $\frac{1}{2}$ price: \$30. If you have a friend or family member who is interested, this is the time to do it.

I hope that you have heard of the new Mensa Voucher program. Beginning in late September, you will receive an e-mail with a discount code for a friend or colleague good for submitting prior evidence or sitting for a supervised test at no cost. Word of mouth is the most effective recruiting strategy, so who better than our own members to help us identify and recruit new prospects to Mensa? Vouchers will be good from Oct 1 to March 31. The code can be used any time during that time. This is even a better deal than ¹/₂ price testing!

Mensa Foundation scholarship application is now available. Applicants don't have to be a current or recent high school student to qualify for a scholarship. Some scholarships are for returning students or graduate students.
