

From Rotten Boroughs to the Great Reform Act of 1832

Beneath the gaiety of election time and the chairing of the Member lay a process riddled with corruption.

George III made William Pitt the Younger Prime Minister in December, 1783. Pitt was only 24 at the time. Pitt led England through the first hard years of the Napoleonic Wars.

In 1789, France erupted into a blood-soaked Revolution. The Guillotine and The Terror were thought likely to plunge England into revolution. Only years later, after the Battle of Waterloo in 1815 had brought the war against France to an end, that England dared to discuss the reform of Parliament.

Elections were extremely corrupt. Some towns like Old Sarum, which became part of Salisbury in 1953, had really ceased to exist. Nevertheless an M.P. still represented the fields where they once stood. These were the so-called "Rotten Boroughs."

Different laws in various parts of the country concerning those who could vote. There was no secret ballot and people were often threatened into voting for a certain candidate.

The Reform Bill of 1832 marked the beginning of democracy in England as we know it today. "Rotten Boroughs" were abolished and the law about who had the right to vote became uniform if restrictive.

In the country the right to vote was allowed to occupants of lands and tenements at a rent of not less than £50 per annum. In the boroughs the right to vote was allowed to occupants of houses and shops at a value of at least £10 per annum.

56 English boroughs lost their Parliamentary membership altogether and 30 had their membership reduced to one. 22 new boroughs were created with two members each, and 20 with one member each. As if to mark the end of the Age of Corruption, the Houses of Parliament were accidentally burnt down.

Mensa Admissions Test: 2 tests are given. You only have to meet the requirements on one to qualify for Mensa. Please let us know if you are coming so that we know how many to expect.

What to bring: Your payment (\$30 in cash, check made out to American Mensa or credit card), photo I.D. Anyone under age 18 must have a signed parental permission form (available at the test or from the Testing Coordinator via e-mail). The test is only for candidates age 14 and older. Younger candidates may apply using evidence from other tests.

With a break, the testing should last about 2 hours. Plan to arrive a few minutes early; if you arrive after the first test has begun, you will have to wait until it is completed and can join the other candidates for the second test.



Callow Youth Encounters Famous Poet



Here's a picture my father took of Carl Sandburg at his 75th birthday party. The party was at Don Shoemaker's, my Episcopalian Godfather's house in Kenilworth. Don was the editor of the *Citizen-Times* in the 1940s and 50s and became a friend of the Sandburgs when they moved to Connemara. My father and Sandburg became friends through Don. I was actually at this very party at age 10 and Sandburg asked me if I'd ever read any of his poetry. I said yes but then asked him why it didn't rhyme! (Thankfully he liked children, laughed and proceeded to tell me about poetic license.) Dad developed the negative and printed the photo in his darkroom. I found the print in his effects long after he died and had a local photo shop do a digital restoration and reprint which turned out very well.
