Bob Bouvier recalls...

He has been completely supportive of me and the other officers which has made taking on the duties of a new responsibility less mysterious and stressful. Now I learn he's been a member for 50 years, nearly as long as American Mensa has existed (est. 1960)! We all owe a great deal to this man.

I have lived many years and have met thousands of people but have only met one man who fits this bill, and his name is Wayne Stanko. As for non-Mensa activities, I have always been amazed by what he does - running, biking, power walking, hiking and always involved with his community and handling events such as the races at Bele Chere.

He started the French Broad chapter 24 years ago and has been nurturing it ever since, handling everything from planning events, arranging for speakers, testing of new members, and publishing the BROADCAST and distributing it to us (that's 24 x 12 so that's 288 issues and that's really a lot of work).

We're very lucky Wayne and his wife Jan live in Asheville.

One member reports, to show it wasn't "all work and no play"...

Over 20 years ago Wayne arranged for the head of the Asheville Nudist Society to speak at a Mensa meeting. It was early in January and the weather suddenly turned very cold and icy so there were only 5 of us huddled around the living room fire. It was a very interesting conversation, including the way the group used to meet at the Asheville YWCA for a nude swim. They had to cover those very large glass windows first, and I remember those windows which almost reached the ceiling and thought "good luck with that." I believe those windows are gone now.
