MERF Scholarships

French Broad Mensa invites western North Carolina residents to apply for Mensa Education and Research Foundation Scholarships. One does not need to be a member of Mensa to apply. Anyone who will be enrolled in an accredited U.S. college, university, or community college for the Fall term of 2020 is eligible.

Awards will be made on the basis of an essay of fewer than 550 words, which describes the applicant's career, vocational, or academic goal and how they plan to achieve the goal.

Entries will be judged and awarded at three levels: local, regional and national. There will be at least one local \$600 award. Awards at other levels could be as much as \$1000.



Regional Vice-Chairman's Message



I'm pleased to announce that South Coast Mensa has agreed to host a Leadership Development Workshop (LDW) in Mobile, AL on March 6-8, 2020. The last two regional LDWs have been hosted by Charlotte Blue Ridge Mensa, so having one on the western side of Region 5 is really good news. There will be folks from nearby regions there, too, if past experience is any predictor.

So, what's a Leadership Development Workshop? Glad you asked! It's a gathering of leaders and wannabe leaders from across the region to learn how to make a local group stronger. Don't let the word "wannabe" put you off. Mensa is totally led by volunteers, and volunteer means YOU! Of course, we expect the LocSecs and Editors and Treasurers to be there to learn more about their crafts, but if you have ever thought about getting Youth activities started in your local group, or increasing attendance at local events, etc., then YOU should be there, too. The LDW is open to any Mensa member who resides in Region 5, or nearby regions.

Participants pay for their transportation, lodging (we have negotiated room rates of \$75 per night, including breakfast), and \$25 registration fee. Region 5 will pay for everything else, including Friday night dinner; Saturday lunch and dinner; meeting room rentals, AV equipment, badges, handouts, etc.

If you have presented an LDW workshop session at a regional or national gathering, we'd love to hear from you. The actual workshop sessions will be determined by polling the attendees in advance, but we are looking for regional and national leaders to teach the sessions.

So – write March 6-8, 2020 on your calendars now. We'll be sending out more information in the coming months.

A favorite theme of mine is that the Jewel awards are a Blueprint for how to make your local group stronger in both participation and numbers. 

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes August 5, 2019

The ExComm meeting was held at Grace Lehto's home in Asheville. Attendees included Sharron Armel, Michael Havelin, Grace Lehto, Will McGuffin, and Wayne Stanko.

The September schedule of events was established. Sharron noted that since our request for use of the Governor's Western Residence pavilion for our August Thu.D. was not approved, she has requested the space for September.

Grace Lehto presented information about the "Heart of Horse Sense" farm that provides therapy to children and adults dealing with autism, PTSD, and other issues. The owner/manager has offered a special one-hour orientation tour just for our Mensa group on Saturday, October 12. Grace will provide more details in the October newsletter.

Regarding our June decision to seek approval of a By-Laws change to allow two-year terms for ExComm members, Sharron Armel reported on our process as required by existing By-Laws:

- 1. Becky Folger, on behalf of the national office, gave approval to proceed.
- 2. Publication in our newsletter was done in late June.
- 3. More detailed article appeared in the August newsletter.
- 4. Lizzz Russell will publish the current By-Laws on the FBM website.
- 5. Group members will vote by paper ballot to be published in the September newsletter.
- 6. Deadline for ballot return (no fewer than 90 days following the first publication of the proposal) is October 1, 2019.
- 7. To become effective, an amendment requires an affirmative vote of the majority of those casting valid ballots, as well as the above approval of the AMC.

We got 9 of 11 right. We finished in sixth place, seven points behind the winner.



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
