




Ham Radio

During times of disaster or crisis, many forms of communication such as cell phones, landlines, and the internet could fail. The one form that should still be available is ham radio. Wouldn't you like to be one of the people licensed to operate radios during such times?

You can and should get licensed! The life you save might be your own or someone you love.

Ham radio is amateur radio. You need a license to operate a radio on public airwaves. The FCC has allocated a section of these airwaves just for amateurs. There are three levels of licenses — Technician, General, and Amateur Extra. The entry-level Technician license requires just a little bit of studying and no great expense. You can get an entry level ham radio for under \$100, the 35-question test costs \$10, and you should buy a book to prepare for the test.

Here are the steps:

1. Get your federal FCC Registration Number (FRN). It's free, and you have to have it to get a ham license. You get the FRN number as soon as you fill out the form online. Here's the link:

2. Get the book entitled: ARRL TECH Q&A 7TH EDITION # 0864. You can get it for less than \$20 at this website:

4. Find an Amateur Radio License Exam in Your Area

The test costs \$10, and you have to bring your FRN and a photo ID with you.


Horrible Pig Story


