

Regional Vice Chairman's Message



The timing is bad this month – the quarterly AMC meeting is scheduled for March 19, 2022 in Hurst TX (the National Office) and the agenda is packed. I would dearly wish to be able to report on our deliberations and decisions this month, but that will have to wait for next month.

Some of the agenda is just housekeeping motions – like the changes to ASIE 2007-073 to clarify how the Strategic Planning

Committee's Chair and members are appointed. Some of the Agenda is Top Secret, like the ever-present Executive Session to discuss personnel, legal, and other issues. Some of the Agenda is second-hand – topics which were so inflammatory at the last meeting that they were postponed to the next meeting. This includes use of the Membership List.

New topics include the motion to adopt the 2022-2023 budget, the annual motion to appoint the auditor, and a motion to establish the three- and five-year membership fund, which has been in existence for a number of years but is finally being formally recognized as an AMC-designated endowment fund. There are also motions to establish two new Task Forces, the Volunteerism Task Force and the Criminal Acts Task Force, because Task Forces must be established by the AMC.

There is also a flurry of motions from the new Chair of the Communications Committee, Robin Crawford, and her Committee. First is a motion to delete ASIE 2006-019, which has to do with the Forum Administrator(s). Next is a motion concerning ASIE Appendix 15, Release of Information, followed by a review of the Information and Privacy Policy. The Committee is also moving to replace Appendix 23 of the ASIEs with a new statement.

This will be followed by several presentations – Education by the Treasurer, Taz Criss; A Strategic Planning Committee Update by Jon

Gruebele; and a Lapsed Member Data Presentation by the Membership Officer, Kimberly Strickland.

Altogether, the Agenda is 22 pages long. In preparation for each meeting, the AMC member must also sift through multiple forum entries in the private AMC Forum explaining each motion, and agitating for or against its passage. How did I ever think this job was going to be fun? Oh, wait – fun was never the objective. But I was focused on how nice it would be to visit other local groups and meet the leaders. Ah, but COVID took care of that. Few local groups want to risk COVID by having a face to face meeting these days.

Anyway, I'll let you know how these agenda items worked out, next month. Happy New Year! (You have renewed your membership already, right? If not, do it fast! You'll be dropped from the rolls April 30 if you haven't renewed by then!)

The Executive Committee met Monday, April 4 at Asiana Grand Buffet in south Asheville. Officers and advisors present were Sharron Armel, Michael Havelin, Grace Lehto, and Wayne Stanko.

The group welcomed Dawn Hardin as a visitor to today's meeting.

Testing and Proctor Issues: Wayne shared some very positive feedback he received (as Testing Coordinator) from an applicant he had referred to the local Mensa-approved testing site.

Scholarships: Wayne (as Scholarship Chair) expects to have the final results from American Mensa regarding scholarships to be awarded this year. Then we will be able to award our local scholarship to the candidate with the highest score (excluding any who have received national awards).

Membership: Sharron reported that she and Johanna have been making plans for further contact with candidates who take the practice test but haven't yet pursued admission, starting with personal contact by telephone. The group brainstormed more ways to reach interested people, and Wayne noted the advertising he does in connection with the scholarship contest. Free advertising throughout the year may be available at AVL Today, Daily Planet, Iwanna, Asheville Freecycle, UNCA, Craig's List, signs in bookstores and libraries. Sharron and Johanna will follow up on these possibilities.

Website: Sharron reported that our current Webmaster, Lizzz Russell, has asked us to find her replacement. Lizzz took over the website in early 2019, and has managed it flawlessly. She has indicated that she will continue to post our newsletter while needed, and is available to train her replacement. The group talked over some features that we'll want to continue. Sharron will approach an AB Tech instructor and local website designer who may be able to give us suggestions for keeping our website simple and functional; follow-up next month.
